



## Dual Enrollment English at Hillsboro High School

### What is Dual Enrollment English?

Dual Enrollment is an enrichment opportunity that allows HHS students to earn college credits for courses taken through Nashville State Community College while still being enrolled in high school. As a dual enrolled student, you are enrolled in both high school and NSCC.

Over the course the fall and spring semesters, students study style, syntax, and organizational patterns of composition and focus heavily on reading comprehension and analysis. Topics include rhetorical patterns, audience, purpose, diverse perspectives, writing, revising, and editing.

### When is Dual Enrollment English taken?

Students are encouraged to take the course during their junior year. Completion of the course provides students with credit for ENG III/ENGL 1010 and ENG IV/ENGL 1020.

### What are the requirements to take Dual Enrollment English?

In order to take the course, students:

- Must be FAFSA eligible (U.S. citizen, legal permanent resident, or other eligible non-citizen);
- Must have an MNPS recommended GPA of 3.0;
- Scored an of 18 on English and a 19 on Reading ACT OR passed the Accuplacer Placement Test\*, an assessment that requires students to pass a short online test in Writing and Reading; and
- Must earn a B or higher in ENG III/ENGL 1010 (First Semester) in order to keep State grant for ENG IV/ENGL 1020 (Second Semester).
